### **Synopsis**

"Since the death of his pregnant wife in a Haitian earthquake 12 years ago, Victor Fielding (Leslie Odom, Jr.) has raised their daughter, Angela (Lidya Jewett) on his own. #### Themes

- The Power of Love and Compassion: Highlighting how love, compassion, and human connections can serve as a powerful defense against dark forces.
- Fear and Horror: Exploring the psychological and emotional impact of facing demonic or supernatural entities, and how it affects the characters.
- Supernatural Mystery and Suspense: The disappearance of the two girls and their return with no memory of the events sparks a mystery surrounding supernatural occurrences. The theme explores the unknown and unexplainable.

#### **Notes**

In "The Exorcist: Believer," the story picks up five decades after the original events of the iconic horror film "The Exorcist." The movie's narrative takes a new turn, exploring the ongoing legacy of the terrifying demonic entity, Pazuzu. ## Unseen Darkness - Mixed Media


#### **1. Written Treatment**




## **1. Written Treatment**

After almost 40 years of being in the **cinema** landscape, The Exorcist has plenty of backstories to lean into and a rich history to tell. This approach leans heavily onto the idea of a **historical graphic timeline** regarding the events leading up to the most recent film. The **red** line being used throughout the sequence is representative of the **blood** and darkness and as we **follow** it through the years it covers the **events** of all the Exorcists leading up to the most recent. In essence it's a history lesson on darkness driven by a thick red line lm referring to as **THE BLOODLINE**.






## Summary



#### **Unseen Darkness**






